Welcome back to our final term! Where has the year gone? I hope that you all managed to find some time to spend with family and friends over the term break.

This week is literacy week! Our tamariki have been enjoying visiting the Leeston library, hearing different teachers sharing their favourite books, and being read to in the library by parents at break times. We are all really looking forward to coming dressed as our favourite book character tomorrow for our book character parade at 9.10am.

As you will be aware, I was privileged to travel to Finland to explore their education system, as part of a Principal's Tour of Education. I was lucky enough to visit the Moomin Museum in Tampere and I fell in love with the literacy character Moomintroll. The Moomins are central characters in a series of books by Swedish-Finn illustrator and writer Tove Jansson, originally published in Swedish in Finland in the 1960s. They are a family of trolls who are white and roundish, with large snouts. The carefree and adventurous family live in their house in Moomin Valley and have many adventures with their various friends! I have bought a book to donate to our library (written in English!), so that we can all share these adventures together!

I really enjoyed exploring the Finish schooling system, which lasts nine years, with children starting school the year they turn 7 until they are 16. All schools are the same – the children do not have a school uniform, they all follow a national core curriculum and they are all publicly funded. Children attend the nearest school to where they live. As there is little variation in schools, they have a saying that their nearest school is the best school!

Children either walk or bike to school (very few are dropped off by car). The school day is relatively simple and follows a general pattern of a 45 minute lesson, followed by a 15 minute break outside (even in the rain and snow – although the children are dressed for the weather!) and a free healthy school lunch for all students and teachers. School nurses, psychologists and social workers work in each school (some for part of the week if the school is smaller). There are no school or teacher inspections in Finland. Local administrators, pupils and parents have high trust for their teachers, and education autonomy is high at all levels.

While it was wonderful to see a different education system, it also highlighted for me the things that we do well here. Kapa haka, whole school productions, school camps and trips, literacy and numeracy, sport and PE and encouraging children to think and problem solve are aspects that come directly to mind.

I am looking forward to seeing many of you at our book parade tomorrow morning - I wonder if you can guess who I might be dressed as!

We will be discussing the Positive Behaviour for Learning School-Wide framework, also known as PB4L.

ECOWARRIORS AT LEESTON SCHOOL

We have had a busy time preparing for spring. We have been making our own potting mix, planting seeds in pits and in the gardens and planting spuds, brassicas and other greens in the garden. A big thank you to CD, Jonesy and Mrs. Phelan who have helped with the gardens, getting seeds and plants and helping the Eco Warriors.



Our wonderful Eco warriors have been involved in a fun citizen science project called 'Bug Bags', developed to monitor the macroinvertebrate population down the Waikirirkiri/Selwyn River (whilst also connecting tamariki and communities to their local waterway and have some fun)!

We have made 'bug bags' using all natural materials, this involved learning how to do a blanket stitch. We had to cut out our hessian sacks to a bug shape, then sew them up using a blanket stitch, remembering to leave a bit of a hole to stuff in our flax and cabbage leaves and stones. Then sew up our bug bag ready to put into the river at Coes Ford.

On Monday 21st Oct a group of us will head to Coes Ford and put our bug bags in the river. While in the river they will be great homes for lots of wonderful bugs. Then in 3 or 4 weeks time we will return to Coes Ford to hopefully find and retrieve our bags. We will carefully open them and see what lovely bugs have made a home in there. The types of bugs we find will tell us how clean the river is. The bugs will be carefully returned to the river and we will pass on our findings to Environment Canterbury.

Watch this space to see what we find!!!



The long distance run will be held **Thursday 17 October** on the school grounds before the School Athletics Day. Remember children will compete in their **YEAR LEVEL GROUPS.**

If you would like to take your child/children home at the conclusion of events please ensure they are *checked off by their class teacher*. *Bus children* will also need to ensure they have *signed off the bus list*. *No lunch orders* for the day either please.

Year 3 - 6 children (Waiwhio & Waikekewai Syndicates)

The children will be **competing in their events between 9.30am – 2.20pm** (they will be required to assemble at 9.10am). They will break for **lunch between 1.40 - 2.00pm**. There will be **no official morning tea break** however they will carry their bags around their events, enabling them to snack as they go. Children should also have a drink bottle – preferably water. **Children SHOULD NOT** be buying their lunch from the Ellesmere College canteen.

- Children will be competing in High Jump, Long Jump, Discus, Shot Put, and Sprints.
- Children will compete in their year levels.
- Boys and girls will compete separately.
- Equipment will be modified depending on the age group.
- Children should stay until the completion of ALL events.
- The sprint finals will be completed within the timeframe of the activity.
- · All children need to bring their lunch.

Gear and Clothing

All children in years 3 to 6 will carry their bags around the events with them. This is so the children can snack and drink when there is time available.

All children will need to be well prepared for the day. They will need to bring:

- Suitable sports clothing, including a warm jacket or track suit for between events.
- Sports shoes, although they may be taken off for Sprints, High Jump and Long Jump.
- Sunscreen and sun hat. It will be their responsibility to ensure they reapply their sunscreen and keep their sunhats on when they are not competing. Sunscreen will be made available to the children during the day.
- Substantial morning tea, lunch and a large drink.
- Medication, such as inhalers kept in their school bag.
