ECO WARRIORS

Our wonderful Leeston Eco Warriors have been part of a fun citizen science project called 'Bug Bags', developed to monitor the macroinvertebrate population down the Waikirikiri/Selwyn River (whilst also connecting tamariki and communities to their local waterway and have some fun)!

On October the 21st we headed down to the Coes Ford to put our handmade bug bags into the Selwyn River, a beautiful calm sunny day. We made the most of the beautiful weather and did dome kick samples in the river to see what invertebrates we could find, see photos.


The students had a great time. After much sorting and classifying of our bugs, we found that most of our bugs were in the yellow zone, (green being the best and red being the worst) which meant that the Selwyn River was doing ok.

We put our 10 bug bags into the river and tied them securely with string to river bank branches. We left them to be homes for bugs, and in a few weeks we would return to retrieve them and see what bugs had made their homes in them.

BUT..... the weather had other ideas! No one expected the enormous amount of water that was to come, see river flow chart.

We returned on November the 4th to a much higher and faster river. We amazingly found 8 bug bags, some hanging on for dear life in the raging current and some washed up on the shore! Unfortunately there was mainly mud in our bug bags and a few bugs that had managed to hang on. But what a great learning experience! The 2 missing bug bags have probably made their way to Lake Ellesmere where they will provide a great home for bugs and baby fish until they biodegrade. Check out our display in the school Foyer.

We have a zoom meeting next week, with Environment Canterbury and all the other schools along the Selwyn River to discuss our findings and learnings!

We had a fabulous day at the Canterbury Athletics. Leeston School had 18 students competing which included four relay teams. The girls year 5 relay team - Sera Luvenitoga, Ava Borisi, Ireland Bennett and Mary Pouniu, got 3rd overall. This is a fantastic achievement - the relay is 4 x 100m which is a new distance for this event. Ava also got 8th overall in the 80m sprint.
