## ASSESSING THE IMPACT OF SCREEN TIME ON CHILDREN'S LANGUAGE, EDUCATIONAL ABILITY, AND SOCIAL FUNCTIONING FROM INFANCY TO AGE 8

- The Ministry of Social Development's report analyses data from over 6,000 children in New Zealand's Growing Up in New Zealand study to explore how screen exposure affects child development.
- The findings indicate that higher daily screen exposure between 9 months and 5 years of age is associated with less favourable outcomes at ages 5 and 8, including:
  - Lower language and educational abilities
  - Increased peer problems (as reported by parents)
- These results support existing national screen time guidelines and provide valuable insights for evidence-based policies that promote positive outcomes for children's health and development.
- While this report is two years old, it still serves as a timely reminder about the negative effects of excessive screen time on children.

#### <u>COHORT ENTRY – NEW ENTRANT TAMARIKI</u>

From Term 3, 2025, Leeston School will be introducing Cohort Entry for all new entrant tamariki.

#### What is Cohort Entry?

Cohort Entry is a system where children starting school for the first time (new entrants) begin in groups on specific dates throughout the term, rather than individually on or after their 5th birthday. This approach supports smoother transitions and stronger connections for both tamariki and their whānau.

#### Why Cohort Entry?

This decision was made following consultation with our School Board, current school community, and contributing Early Learning Providers.

We have identified a number of benefits, including:

- Improved wellbeing and learning outcomes for tamariki
- More effective and structured transition processes
- Stronger relationships and communication between parents, whānau, staff, and Early Learning Providers
- Enhanced opportunities for tamariki to build friendships and feel settled by starting alongside peers

#### **2025 Cohort Entry Dates**

New 5-year-old students will start school on **one of two cohort entry points per term**:

#### Term 3:

Monday 14th July
 Monday 18th August

#### Term 4:

Monday 6th October
 Monday 10th November

**Note:** Children must have turned 5 **on or before** the chosen cohort entry date.

Example: If your child turns 5 on 30th July, they would begin school on the second Term 3 entry date – Monday 18th August.

If a child is transferring from another school (i.e. they are already enrolled elsewhere), our Cohort Entry policy **does not apply**.
